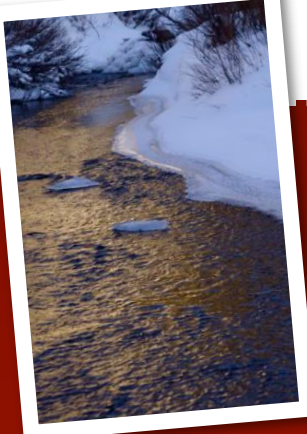

FOREIGN EXCHANGE HOSTING

In partnership with the Education Travel & Culture (ETC) corporation , City Academy has the opportunity to host three or four exchange students from around the world this coming semester. ETC is a non-profit corporation for student exchange.

ETC Outbound Programs are focused on the academic and personal development of students willing to experience life abroad. In most outbound programs, students are placed with a volunteer host family that will help guide and provide a loving household. Families are carefully screened and oriented to ensure that students are placed in a supportive environment that is conducive to learning and adapting to a new culture. Local Coordinators carefully monitor students' progress both academically and with their new families.
