City Academy Flag Football (Oct 14, Results)

The City Academy Flag Football team returned to Legacy Field on Friday October 14 to play against Meridian School. The Dragons marched down the field on their first possession, but just could not punch the ball into the end zone. Meridian stormed back and scored to go ahead 6-0 after a failed conversion. On its next possession, City advanced the ball to just past midfield and called a timeout with only 6 seconds left in the half. A quick huddle produced a trick play which resulted in a pass from one wide receiver to another (Tyler Schirm to Walker Candelaria) as the half ended. The conversion was unsuccessful, so the score was 6-6 at the half.

The Dragons moved the ball well again in the 2nd half, and scored early to go up 12-6 on a long scrambling run by Quarterback Alec Emery, but their conversion attempt failed. The Meridian team would not quit, and roared back to score with 2 minutes to tie the game. They converted their one-point attempt to pull ahead 13-12. In what is becoming habit, City had another chance to win late in the game, but their efforts fell just short as Meridian intercepted a pass and then ran out the clock.

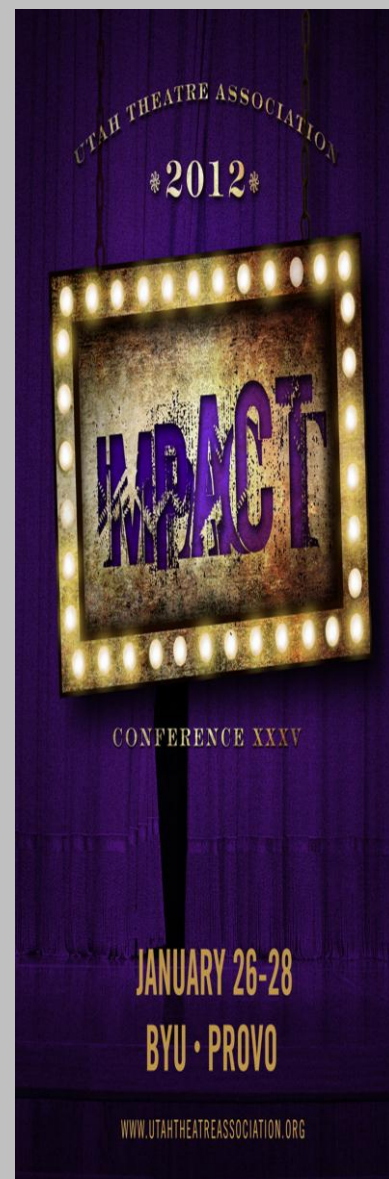
We're growing!!

Due to the increasing participation in our annual conference, we are growing out of many theater spaces on our host campuses. This next conference, we are going to try what many other theatre festivals and conferences do: splitting up all-conference events. So instead of everyone being able to be in the same space at once, each school and participant will be assigned to a specific time to attend our all-conference events. Every participant will see the same show, hear the same speaker, etc. as all-conference events will be held twice. We ask you for your support in this endeavor as we figure out how best to handle our higher numbers.

Conference Kick-off

For our opening conference event, we will be hosting a school showcase! Each registered school will be allowed to submit one performance piece to showcase at the kick-off. This piece will showcase and highlight the work of that program and those students, so it could be an acting piece such as a scene, monologue or ensemble work; a musical theatre piece; a pantomime; or some other work from your program. The more unique to your program the better! There will be more details about this showcase on our website by the end of September, and full details will be outlined in the registration packet.

Start thinking now about what makes your program stand out! Then if you would like to show off the awesome work your students do, find a short performance piece that can be showcased at the conference. We want to see your students shine!
